CORRIGENDUM

Dhanbad, the 17th August, 2021

G.S.R. 577(E).—In pursuance of the provisions of Regulation 13(4) of the Metalliferous Mines Regulations, 1961, the Bye-lays notified vide GSR 563(E) dated 12th August, 2021, for conduct of examination for Mining Mate's Certificates of Competency, the following clauses, therein, are substituted as below:

THE CLAUSES:

“2.0 Type of Examination – Persons who have passed Senior Secondary School Examination or Intermediate examination or its equivalent from a recognized Board or University have to appear the type of examination at Clause (A) and persons who have not passed Senior Secondary School Examination or Intermediate examination or its equivalent from a recognized Board or University and are not familiar with use of Computer, may opt for the type of examination at Clause (B), as below:

3.0 Computer Based Test (CBT)

4.0 The examination shall consist of a Computer Based Test (CBT) of two hours duration.

i. Marks:---The examination shall carry a total maximum of 100 marks. In order to pass the examination a candidate must obtain not less than 50% of the maximum marks in Computer Based Test (i.e. at least 50 out of 100).

(A) Oral Examination:”**ARE SUBSTITUTED AS:**

“2.0 Type of Examination – Persons who have passed Senior Secondary School Examination or Intermediate examination or its equivalent from a recognized Board or University have to appear the type of examination at Clause (A) and persons who have not passed Senior Secondary School Examination or Intermediate examination or its equivalent from a recognized Board or University and are not familiar with use of Computer, may opt for the type of examination at Clause (B), as below:

(A) Computer Based Test (CBT)

- i. The examination shall consist of a Computer Based Test (CBT) of two hours duration.
- ii. Marks: -The examination shall carry a total maximum of 100 marks. In order to pass the examination a candidate must obtain not less than 50% of the maximum marks in Computer Based Test (i.e. at least 50 out of 100).
